Pedagogy

- Explicit teaching, direct teaching, intensive teaching, structured review drill and practice
- Gradual Release of Responsibility Model used across units, lesson and activities
- Target setting individualised and group basis / learning goals
- Differentiation meeting the needs of learners
- Adjustments students with disability and high-achieving students
- Targeted use of Learning Walls
- Provision of learning that is intellectually challenging and meaningful to the student
- Use of ICTs in range of learning experiences
- Prep: Intentional teaching via active learning, explicit teaching and play-based activities (age-appropriate pedagogies)
- Intensive teaching: warm-up, plough back, intensive intervention
- Interactive Teaching: whole class discussion, cooperative learning, peer-partner learning, guided instruction
- Indirect Teaching: problem-based learning, independent learning
- Professional Development for teachers that examines how students learn and how we need to teach
- Local community partnerships enhancing the learning process

Reporting

Informal feedback to students and families is an ongoing process that is linked with target setting, Prep to Year 6

Formal written reports distributed twice yearly. Precise format mandated. Reports individualised with personalised comments linked to evidence of student performance.

Parent-Teacher interviews twice a year plus invitations for ongoing communication (via emails, visits and phone calls). 'Meet the Teacher' event in Term One.

Mandated yearly reporting of student performance for NAPLAN.

Internal monitoring, case management and analysis of data (Professional Learning Teams)

Conversations involving teachers and school leadership team occur each term to standardise curriculum intent and personalise teaching & learning to student needs.

Cluster moderation processes support standardising teaching & learning and provides feedback to teachers and to the school on the quality and standard of curriculum intent.

- B Best quality teaching for all
- E Everyone learns everyday adjustments and Differentiation
- S Specialised learning identified students receive additional support -adjustments detailed in support plan (Personalised Learning Program)
- T Targeted Learning students with high needs have individual plans written (e.g. Individual Curriculum Plan)
